

## Rules and Regulations

Guidelines for camping at Camp Twin Lakes are in line with national BSA and Bay-Lakes Council policies and the state of Wisconsin, which include Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat. Failure to comply with these standards may result in our campmasters asking you and your family to leave the grounds.

1. All campsites must have at least two adults present at all times.
2. All youth must be with a buddy when walking in the campground and camp property
3. All injuries, no matter how small they may seem, must be reported to the campmaster upon occurrence.
4. Firewood is available at the camp. If you bring your own, you must reside in the state of Wisconsin. Fires must be contained to the fire ring provided in each campsite.
5. Pets are permitted but must be leashed at all times.
6. Only one vehicle is allowed per site. Additional parking is within walking distance of the campsites.
7. When possible, take garbage home to dispose of. A dumpster is available near the exit of the campground.
8. Please don't litter.
9. No cutting of trees or pounding of nails in trees.
10. Quiet time is 11:00 PM.

### WHAT NOT TO BRING

1. Fireworks
2. Alcoholic Beverages
3. Controlled substances
4. All Terrain Vehicles
5. Paintball guns
6. Firearms of any type

## Camp Twin Lakes

Camp Twin Lakes is 425 acres of wooded land located 9 miles south of Waupaca off County Highway K. Part of the camp includes a family camping area featuring 16 campsites of various sizes and capacities depending on the type of camping you want to do.

Beginning August 3, 2007, the camp will open its doors to families from throughout the Bay-Lakes Council, inviting them to experience family camping at Camp Twin Lakes. The campground will be open on weekends only for the first year of operation and will run through the last weekend in September. This is trial run to literally iron out the bugs that develop in the first year of operation and to determine what works and what needs to be refined to make the camper's experience as pleasant, enjoyable and relaxing as possible.

The campground features a centralized uni-sex shower facility with flush toilets, dump station and 16 campsites. Each site has a gravel pad, campfire ring, picnic table and space to park one vehicle. There are no water or electrical hookups in the sites, so all campers must be self-contained. Water is available for use in the sites and can be obtained at the shower house.

There is no laundry service.

The campground is best suited for tents, pop-up campers and travel trailers less than 28 feet. Anything longer may not fit into any of the sites.

### Campground host:

Each weekend campers will be greeted by a campmaster, the host family who will check you in and ensure you get to your campsite safely and efficiently. Campmasters will also provide emergencies services, first aid and general information about the camp and the surrounding area. They are also responsible for enforcing the camping guidelines to ensure everyone has a safe and fun-filled experience.

## Campsite Fees and Registration:

To register, simply fill out the registration form in this brochure and mail, along with the proper fee, to the Center for Scouting. Additional forms are also available by calling the Center for Scouting or visit the council web site at [www.baylakesbsa.org](http://www.baylakesbsa.org). From the main page, click on Twin Lakes family camp. Registration is on a first-come first-served basis and fees must be included with the completed registration form. Fees are non-refundable unless another camper for the same timeframe can fill the reservation.

### Things to do:

While camping, be sure to check out the following:

**Boating:** Campers must provide their own craft and follow Safety Afloat guidelines. Twin Lakes is a no wake lake.

**Fishing off the dock:** Bring your fishing gear.

**Twin Lakes nature trail:** Take a hike with your family and earn a special first year camp patch.

**Religious services:** There are a number of churches in and around Waupaca just a short drive from Camp Twin Lakes. For a complete listing, see your weekend campmaster.

**Chain-O-Lakes:** The campground is only a few miles from the Chain-O-Lakes recreational area. There are a number of family activities you may want to enjoy including:

1. Canoeing the Crystal River or renting a pontoon boat at Ding's Dock
2. Miniature golfing
3. Swimming at the public beach in Waupaca
4. Visit the local movie theater
5. Go hiking and adventure finding
6. Shop the stores and enjoy the local treats
7. Much more!
