Fall Recruitment Success in Two Rivers

Recruiting during a Pandemic, can it be done? Just ask Suzi Zipperer of Pack 3940 in Two Rivers, WI. Her Pack was able to recruit over a dozen new Scouts just at their Join Scouting Night with more calling to sign up after the fact. These results are quite impressive as many Packs throughout the Bay-Lakes Council are struggling to recruit half that.

This year has been brought many new challenges creating even more barriers for families to join Scouting. In many of our school districts, school access has been extremely limited. No school talks (in-person or virtual), no flyers sent home with each child, or join Cub Scout signs on school grounds.

So how did Pack 3940 do it? Well, it was a combination of different tactics. First, the Pack decided on their Join Scouting Night well in advance and got the information to the District. This allowed their event to be geo-fenced on Facebook taking advantage of Council's \$50 investment per Pack for event boosting. They ordered flyers and yard signs which went to the two schools they recruit from.

Second, current leaders and families were asked to be a part of the event. Suzi Zipperer, Jason Zipperer, Becky Hoffmann, Kyle Kozlowski, Heather Anderson, Bethany Dewane rounded out a solid group of leaders on hand at the event. Additional helpers included: Mydasia & Samantha Zipperer of Troop 6925, Lance Anderson of Troop 915, Wendy Brandt, John Hoffmann, and Jill Ahl Unit Commissioner. It is always reassuring for new families to see such a welcoming group at these events. If they are the lone family, the odds of them signing up drops significantly. The school allowed this Pack to have a drive thru sign up in the parking lot. This is another good tactic for sign up events. Pick a location new families are familiar with.

Third, the Pack reached out to principals at both schools asking them to play the virtual Scout talk video the Bay-Lakes Council created in lieu of in person school visits. One principal played the video for students during the school day and the other sent the file out in a stand-alone email to their families. It is amazing what can be done when relationships with the school is strong.

There is still a ton of opportunity to recruit for your Pack this fall. A lot of families are looking for activities for the kids, they just need to know we are still active and meeting safely. Virtual programming is also available for those hesitant about in-person activities.
